



Re: Findings and Recommendations from San Francisco Mayoral Poll

Recent polling on the San Francisco mayoral election shows that Mark Farrell has the most first-choice votes. After allocating votes to simulate the ranked-choice voting process, Farrell comes out on top against Mayor London Breed by a solid margin.

- Fewer than one in five voters say that things in San Francisco are going in the right direction (16% right direction / 46% wrong direction / 34% mixed). 56% agree that things in San Francisco are going poorly, and we need a drastic change to get back on track.
- Farrell leads the race today (23% Farrell / 21% Breed / 20% Lurie / 17% Peskin / 4% Safaí / 5% Someone else / 11% undecided).
- Farrell leads by a solid margin after a ranked-choice simulation (57% Farrell / 43% Breed).



- Nearly two-thirds of voters have unfavorable views of Breed (32% favorable / 61% unfavorable). Undecided voters dislike Breed by a 2-1 margin (24% favorable / 52% unfavorable).
- Two-thirds of voters know Farrell (36% favorable / 30% unfavorable). In an open-ended question, voters describe him as experienced (11%) and moderate (9%).
- **Two-thirds of voters know Lurie** (39% favorable / 27% unfavorable). In an open-ended question, voters describe him as wealthy (22%) and inexperienced (10%).
- **Peskin and Safaí are unpopular**. Peskin is relatively well-known but disliked by a 2-1 margin (26% favorable / 50% unfavorable). Safaí is less well-known but disliked by a similar margin (17% favorable / 36% unfavorable).

Findings and recommendations are based on the results of a live phone and text-to-web survey conducted in English, Spanish, Mandarin, and Cantonese by Impact Research from June 1<sup>st</sup> to June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024, in San Francisco among N=500 likely 2024 general election voters. The margin of error for the full sample is ±4.5%.
